

# Articles Usage Chart

## Indefinite Articles

**"A"** and **"An"** are used in front of singular countable nouns which are not specific.

If the noun starts with a vowel sound, we use **"an"**.

If the noun starts with a consonant sound, we use **"a"**.

## Definite Article

- \* **"The"** is used in front of all nouns (it) whether the nouns are singular, plural or uncountable to describe someone or something specific or unique.

- \* Use **"The"** before superlative adjectives, family names, seas, rivers, oceans, etc.

- \* **"The"** is used before names of some mentioned.
- \* We use **"The"** before something or someone mentioned.

### Examples:

the Earth	the best student
the sky	the USA
the weather	the UK
the Clintons	the Pacific Ocean

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**"a"** comes before it. Example: a cat

**"an"** comes before it. Example: an egg

## No Articles

Use no article before uncountable nouns.

car
