Third Conditionals

The third conditional talks about a hypothetical or unreal situation in the past. To form a third conditional, we use the past perfect in the "if" clause and "would have/could have" and past participle in the other clause.

Example: If you had sent me your poem, I would have published it.
(have sent, had sent)
