Say, Tell or Ask?

Say – We use "**say**" to report a statement or message, without mentioning to whom it is said.

Example: John **said** that he was going to school.

Tell – We use "**tell**" to report statements, imperatives or requests. With "tell" the information is always communicated to someone.

Example: Mrs. Helen **told** us to submit the assignments in time.

Ask – We use "ask" to report questions or requests.

Example: Evelyn **asked** me when I had bought the new car.
