

Prepositional Phrases

A **prepositional phrase** is a group of words consisting of a preposition, its object, and any words that modify the object.

Example: Dan is playing tennis with his friend.

3) My ring fell under the table.

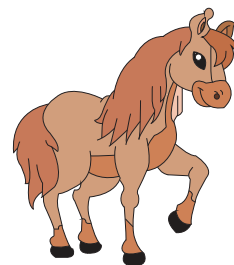
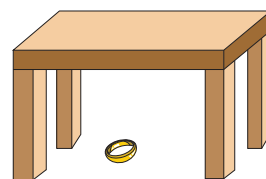
4) The horse beyond the fence is brown.
