Martin Luther King Junior was born on the 15th of January, 1929 in Georgia. He attended Booker T. Washington School in Atlanta and was a very good student. He graduated in sociology from Morehouse College.

Dr. King was a famous leader in the Civil Rights Movement in America during the 1950s and 1960s. Martin Luther King fought for equal rights. He believed all Americans should be treated fairly, no matter what their skin color. He led peaceful protests to change unfair laws.

In 1963 he gave his iconic 'I Have a Dream' speech at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. In 1964 he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.
