Martin Luther King Jr.

Martin Luther King was the youngest winner of the Noble Peace Prize. He was a social activist and fought against racial inequality through peaceful protests.



Harriet Tubman

Harriet was an American abolitionist and political activist. As a "conductor" of the Underground Railroad, she helped around 300 slaves to achieve freedom.



Sojourner Truth

She was a women's rights activist. NASA named a Mars Rover after her. The name Sojourner means "traveler". She's known for her speech "Ain't I a Woman?".



Malcolm X

Malcolm X was the voice of the Black Muslim faith. He put forth the concept of race pride and preached defense against white aggression "by any means necessary".



Rosa Parks

She was called the "mother of the civil rights movement". Her refusal to give up her seat on a public bus, set in motion one of the largest social movements in history.



Maya Angelou

She was best known for her memoir "I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings". Her poem for Bill Clinton "On The Pulse of Morning" won the Grammy Award.




Frederick Douglass

Nicknamed "The Greatest", he is regarded as one of the greatest boxers of all time. He was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2005.



Beyoncé

Beyoncé is the most-nominated female artist, with 62 nominations for Grammy. She is the second female artist who has won 23 Grammy awards.



Langston Hughes

He was an American poet and one of the founding fathers of the Harlem Renaissance. He fought for social justice and racial equality through his literature.



Michelle Obama

As the first African-American first lady from 2009-2017, she served as a role model to several women. She is a lawyer, university administrator and writer.



Michael Jackson

Michael Jackson, "The King of Pop" is a popular international music icon. His "Thriller" album is the most sold album of all time.
