## Say, Tell or Ask?

Say – We use “**say**” to report a statement or message, without mentioning to whom it is said.

**Example:** John said that he was going to school.

Tell – We use “**tell**” to report statements, imperatives or requests. With “tell” the information is always communicated to someone.

**Example:** Mrs. Helen told us to submit the assignments in time.

Ask – We use “**ask**” to report questions or requests.

**Example:** Evelyn asked me when I had bought the new car.
