

A **noun clause** is a dependent clause that functions as a noun in a sentence.

Example: That the team lost is a great pity.

An **adjective clause** is a dependent clause that functions as an adjective in a sentence.

Example: The reason why I resigned is top secret.

An **adverb clause** is a dependent clause that functions as an adverb in a sentence.

Example: erry did the dishes before I started with the laundry.
