

Third Conditionals

The third conditional talks about a hypothetical or unreal situation in the past. To form a third conditional, we use the past perfect in the "if" clause and "would have" in the other clause.

Example: If Sasha **had applied** for the role, she **would have** landed it. (had applied, had been applied)
