

Zero Conditionals

The zero conditional refers to general habits or scientific truths. We use the simple present tense in both parts of a zero-conditional sentence.

Zero conditionals are formed with 'if' or 'when'.

Example: a stranger/enter the house/the dog/bark

When a stranger enters the house, the dog barks.
