

To form a zero conditional, we use the simple present tense in both clauses. Zero conditionals are formed with "if" or "when".

To form a first conditional, we use the simple present tense in the "if" clause and the future simple in the other clause.

To form a second conditional, we use the past simple tense in the "if" clause and "would/could" and "might" in the other clause.

Example: If you are late, I will be angry.
