

## Determiners and Quantifiers

Both the phrases "**a few**" and "**a little**" are quantifiers meaning some. While "**a few**" is used with countable nouns, "**a little**" accompanies uncountable nouns.

**Example** : Ms. Collins had **a little** water before eating.

There were **a few** coins and bills in the purse.
