# Tag Questions

The question tag is made with the same verb as used in the main part of the sentence. If this is an auxiliary verb (a helping verb): "have", or "be", the tag is formed from the auxiliary verb.

Examples: The Aarons are traveling to London, aren't they?

Linda isn't at home today, is she?

If there is no helping verb in the main part of the sentence, the question tag is formed from an appropriate form of "do".

Example: She likes
