Past Perfect: The past perfect tense expresses actions or events completed before a specific time in the past.

Example: Tony had finished the porridge before Lily came home.

Past Perfect Progressive: It refers to an action that started in the past and continued to another time in the past.

Example: Alice had been talking to her friends daily, before she lost her phone.
