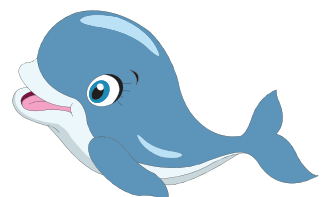
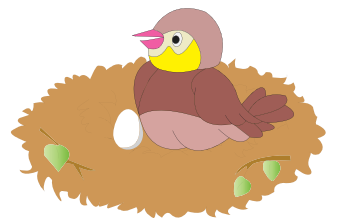
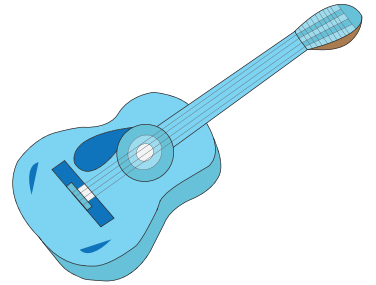
Helping Verbs

A **helping verb, or auxiliary verb**, precedes the main verb in a sentence. It adds details, such as time and mood, to the main verb.

Example: Susan may invite us to her party.
Susan invited us to the party.
