- 1) Find all odd numbers that can be added to 6 to get a total smaller than 18.

- 2) Write all the numbers that can be subtracted from 15 so that the difference is an even number smaller than 10.

- 3) Alan started with 20 marbles. He lost 5 marbles. How many marbles should he have to have the same total number of marbles as he started with?

- 4) Chris has 10 apples. He gave 3 apples to his friend. How many apples are left? Is the number of apples left even or odd?

- 5) Melanie has 12 crayons. She wants to lend some to her classmates so that the number of crayons left is odd and greater than 7. How many crayons can she lend?

- 6) Belinda has 15 crayons. She wants to lend some to her classmates so that the number of crayons left is odd and greater than 7. How many crayons can she lend?

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
