Present Perfect or Present Perfect Progressive?

Present Perfect: It is used to indicate actions or events that occurred at a time that's not specified.

Example: She **has visited** the town.

Present Perfect Progressive: It is used to refer to actions that started in the past and are still in continuation. It is often used with "since" or "for" to indicate the duration of the actions.

Example: Dan has been watching a movie since afternoon.
